Ritzling \$28 (per four pack of 200ml bottles)

Ritzling is a city in Austria and, according to some, the original home of Riesling. While there is no substantiated historical evidence of this - yet - there's no doubt the Romans took Riesling to the countries we now call Austria and Germany. When Martinborough winemaker Chris Archer was casting around for a name for his new low alcohol, sparkling Riesling, he chose Ritzling and sub-titled it 'bottled happiness'. This seems entirely appropriate for a zingy, spritzy, fresh white made from a single vineyard, housed in 200ml bottles and with just 9% alcohol. Yes, this is off-dry. 2011 Bella Invivo Sauvignon Blanc Marlborough \$19-\$20

There is a trend; Bella also has relatively low alcohol at 9%. Mind you, the grapes were picked at 19.1 brix, so if 'she' wasn't in the medium-dry camp (with 4.8 grams of residual sugar), Bella would still only be 10%. This is soft, light, fresh and easy to drink. It is selling like hot cakes both here and in the UK, thanks to its appealing 30% fewer calories than standard Sauvignon Blancs.

2008 Glasnevin Limited Release Riesling

This low alcohol (9.5%) North Canterbury riesling is modelled on a German 'auslese'; fermentation was intentionally stopped well short of dryness to retain this wine's luscious honey-like mouthfeel and its rich taste of apple, pineapple and peach.
